

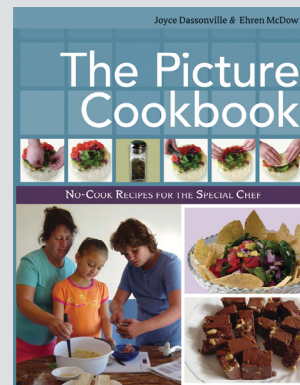

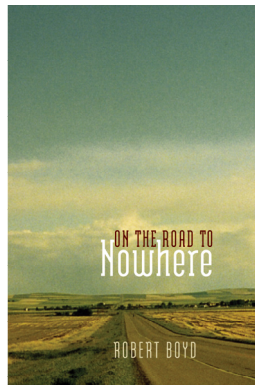
BACKLIST

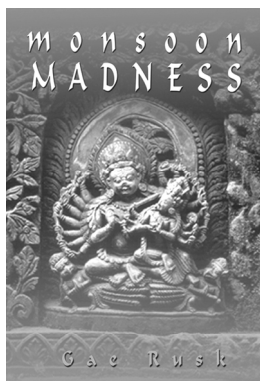
