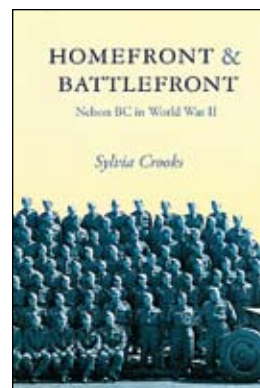

Homefront & Battlefront

Honoured by the BC Historical Federation, *Homefront & Battlefront* vividly recounts the Canadian experience of WW II through the eyes of one community — Nelson. It tells the story of the young men and women who went off to war, seventy of whom did not come home. It is also the remarkable story of how the community raised millions of dollars for the war effort, devoting six years of their civic life to help make victory possible. Their contributions prompted some to call it “the most patriotic town in British Columbia.” This was a story repeated across the country, and so it is a picture of Canadian life during those years.

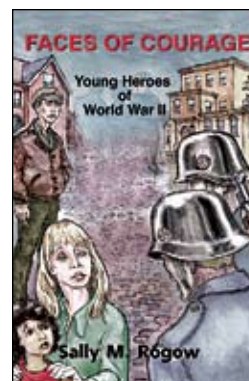
Faces of Courage

F*aces of Courage* depicts the struggle for survival of brave young people who risked their lives to defy the Nazis. There is Kirsten, a young Danish girl who helped save a group of Jewish children, and Yojo, a Gypsy teenager who guided British pilots, downed in the Pyrenees, to freedom in Spain. Jacques, a blind French teenager, organized a student resistance group called Volunteers of Liberty, while the Eidelweiss Pirates were German teenagers who opposed the Hitler Youth and aided homeless Jewish children. Three of the stories relate the heroics of real people; the others are about fictional characters but are based on documented events.
