Lawyer Joe Newbury may have the biggest case of his career, defending the father of the missing Bloomsburg children, in this work of fiction by an accomplished lawyer. However, Joe's life and the case get more complicated as he begins a relationship with Demme, a woman whose search for her missing past ties into environmental issues arising from the run-up to the world's greatest athletic event in 2010.

Echoing Greek mythology, the politics of the city intertwine with the personal lives of its residents as they search for truth, meaning, and belonging. Faith battles with reason to find solutions—to personal questions, ecological destruction, and the unknown fate of the two missing children.

Song on My Lips

Jazz Greats Were My Mentors

Stephen T. Botek, MD

Stephen Botek apprenticed at the side of some of the greats of the jazz era, learning not only about music, but about life. Growing up in small-town Pennsylvania in the shadow of the Dorseys, Botek decides to follow his muse to a future in jazz. He gets mentored by clarinet great Buddy DeFranco and saxophone legend Joe Allard, meets up with greats such as Artie Shaw and Dizzy Gillespie along the way, and follows in Glenn Miller's footsteps with the Army Air Force Band.

A primer on the jazz era, as well as an account of the benefits of apprenticeship, *Song on My Lips* not only recounts stories of the greats but takes us backstage, to their studios, and to many of the unique venues of the time. Jazz aficionados and new musicians alike will learn much about the music from this unique life story.

Excerpt

DeFranco's turn to solo was soon to come. Buddy sat stretching his fingers at every free moment that he could find. He seemed to be nervously preparing himself for that featured moment. Soloists, like Shavers, born in 1917, and old-timers, like Dorsey, born in 1905, were hard acts to follow for the then only 23-year-old giant-to-be.

Tommy's band was always a crowd pleaser. Players were often instructed when soloing on tunes that had been recording best sellers to repeat the solo almost note for note. This idea never pleased DeFranco. He didn't need to remember how he recorded one particular solo, since every time he played that particular tune, he thought of one hundred and one new ways to interpret it. Tommy was referred to as "The Sentimental Gentleman" (of swing) whereas Buddy, as yet, not having a title, could have been called, "Mr. Modern Jazz Up-Tempo Clarinet Virtuoso" (of be-bop).

Dorsey, so the rumor went, never liked be-bop, but whether he liked it or not, in 1946, it was here to stay. So, with one more tune left to play before intermission, Tommy struck up the band with by far the fastest piece yet. I've forgotten the name of the tune, but wow, was the tempo fast! The rhythm section knitted together neatly, while some of the other band members seemed to be hanging on for dear life. Most dancers stopped to listen; the tempo was just too fast for jitterbugging.



Dr Stephen Botek grew up in a musical family and had excellent musical training from a young age. He studied music at Eastman School of Music, University of Rochester, NY and when the Korean War broke out, he joined the US Air Force Band as a clarinetist and chorus member. After the war he entered Columbia University to major on psychology and pre-med. To finance his education he spent his summers touring the world with the USO (United Services Organization). He became a medical doctor and eventually, a psychiatrist. At home and abroad he enjoyed playing both clarinet and saxophone, rubbing shoulders and sharing the stage with many extraordinary musicians. He lives in New York City

Margaret A. Mitchell

The woman who first brought the issue of spousal abuse to the forefront in Canada presents her memoirs in this interesting, informative, entertaining and often humorous book. Margaret Mitchell is a social activist who pioneered community development in Vancouver, was a courageous feminist MP for Vancouver East, and an international adventuress. Her book is a testament to the struggles and achievements of women MPs, and chronicles her life's adventures and work.

As an NDP Member of Parliament, Margaret Mitchell inspired generations of women with her public stand against "wife beating" with her vocal support for women's equality. She spent 14 years in the House of Commons advocating for affordable housing, multiculturalism, and the rights of poor people. Ms Mitchell worked tirelessly on issues that are alive today, including redress for the Chinese Head Tax, and childcare. The Margaret Mitchell Fund for Women, which Ms Mitchell established after her retirement, continues to support women's self-help projects and scholarships. Proceeds of book sales will also accrue to the fund.

Prior to entering political life, Margaret Mitchell pioneered community development in Vancouver, helping people to organize and improve life in the city's poorer neighbourhoods. Many organizations she worked with to achieve greater citizen participation are still active today in one form or another and Ms Mitchell acknowledges the many people who participated with her in these endeavours.

No Laughing Matter is an engaging story that will have broad public appeal and will be of particular interest to those whose lives Ms Mitchell has touched during her time as a community advocate, politician and friend. It will also interest those involved in political science, women's studies and local history.



A graduate of McMaster University and University of Toronto School of Social Work, Margaret A. Mitchell worked for the International Red Cross in Japan and Korea during the Korean War and in Vienna in 1956 with Hungarian refugees. Known for her many contributions as a social activist and in community development, she became the NDP Member of Parliament for Vancouver East from 1979 until 1993. She continues to support women in need through the Margaret Mitchell Fund for Women. Recognized in 2000 as a Member of the Order of British Columbia, she lives in Vancouver, BC.

During his 40-year career, architect Rand Iredale (1929–2000) initiated a compelling vision for the redevelopment of downtown Vancouver, was a mentor to some of BC's most accomplished architects practising today, and became one of the pioneers of heritage preservation in British Columbia. Throughout the book a chronology of selected projects is interwoven with guest essays and interviews, writings by Rand and Kathryn Iredale, and touching family anecdotes.

A man of immense curiosity and generosity, Rand enjoyed both a mathematical mind and a philosophical soul. He was a great master planner and design collaborator on projects that included the Science Complex at Simon Fraser University, the Sedgewick Undergraduate Library at the University of British Columbia, the Westcoast Transmission Building in downtown Vancouver, and Place des Arts at Maillardville Heritage Square in Coquitlam.

Finding a Good Fit is ultimately about relationships: between land and building, engineer and architect, apprentice and mentor, husband and wife, father and child. And it is about partnerships: with family, friends, colleagues, clients, and communities.

Sheila Martineau has worked for many years as a researcher and writer, and has a broad background in project marketing, graphic design, and fibre art. Combined with her qualitative analyses of 'artists in relation to their art,' Sheila takes a holistic approach to writing, editing, and designing books that showcase the lives and works of creative professionals. She lives in Vancouver, BC.

Kathryn Iredale's book on the life and work of her husband, Rand Iredale, derives both from their long and happy family life together and from her desire to document Rand's prominence and influence in the roles of pioneer, architect, and mentor. Kathryn worked alongside Rand for many years, and developed a keen understanding of the architectural profession and of Rand's professional practice. Humpback whale watchers in Hawaii and whale lovers everywhere will find this an easy guide to the latest research findings. An absorbing account of whale behaviour and how researchers try to document and understand it, this book is based on Dr. Jim Darling's professional summary of recent research. He distinguishes speculation from fact and provides links to the original research articles. Research methods and technology are explained, showing how humans are unravelling these creatures' deep mysteries. Graced with extraordinary photographs and illustrations, the book traces the history of whale research from its beginnings through the present to a look into the future, setting signs of humpback survival against the possible restart of whaling.

Charles "Flip" Nicklin is a world-renowned underwater photographer. He has spent his 30-year career specializing in the photography of marine mammals, especially whales and dolphins. Through 17 National Geographic articles from 1982 to the present, he has worked closely with top whale researchers from around the world. Flip has assisted on humpback whale studies in Hawaii since the 1980s and lives in Maui for a portion of each year.

Susan W. Barnes' art portrays life on our beaches and in our oceans, with a special focus on whales. She has long supported studies dedicated to the education, protection and awareness of the world's oceans. Sue lives in a cottage by the sea on a coastal meadow located on California's Carmel Bay.



Jim Darling has led research programs on whales for over 25 years and has written many scientific and popular publications, including Gray Whales. His interest began when surfing alongside them off the west coast of British Columbia. His primary studies include long-term investigations of humpback whales throughout the North Pacific. Jim was a founder and executive director of West Coast Whale Research Foundation, now the Pacific WildLife Foundation, and is on the advisory board of the Whale Trust, Maui. Since 1997 Maui has been the base for his study on the function of the humpback whale song. When not in Hawaii, he divides his time between Vancouver and Tofino, BC.

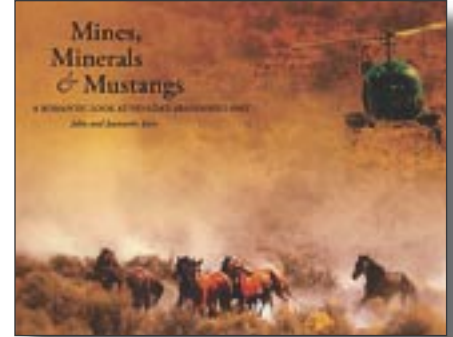
A Romantic Look at Nevada's Abandoned Past

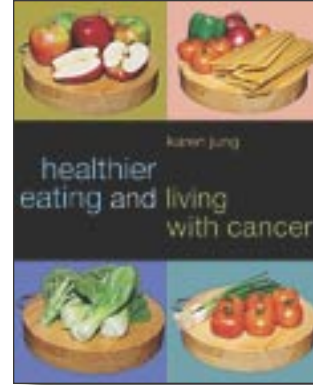

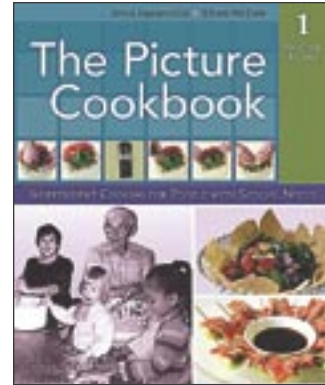

There has never been a cookbook like this, nor has there been a book that could improve the lives of families with special needs members more than this book has the potential to do. After a futile search to buy a book for teaching her daughter to cook, the author eventually wrote the book she had sought to buy. The first in a series of four cookbooks for budding chefs with special needs including autism, attention deficit disorder, Down's Syndrome, Alzheimer's disease, illiteracy, advanced or young age, *The Picture Cookbook* is the result of the author's four years of efforts teaching her own autistic daughter to cook and bake.

The title says it all, but the book is more than a series of step-by-step pictures leading the chef to a proud completion. All aspects of avoiding injury and ensuring success have been cleverly thought through. Using modern kitchen tools, the authors have written recipes that are safe for anyone to use, be they young children, confused adults or people with special needs. Furthermore, for the benefit of teachers and caregivers, instructions on the process of teaching someone to use the cookbook are detailed, as well as discussions of issues that can arise.

The picture index allows cooks to easily spot their favourite recipes without the need to read or understand names. The book boasts lay-flat binding, extensive colour-coding, and beautifully laid out colour photography.

Ehren McDow is a trained chef and professional baker. He is Joyce's son and Dominique's older brother. At his insistence, he began cooking with his mother at age two. He applies his culinary arts training to modify and create recipes appropriate for people with special needs. An avid reader of cooking books and science fiction, Ehren lives in Vancouver, BC.



Joyce Dassonville has worked as a registered nurse, family law and personal injury litigation lawyer, appeal commissioner and dispute resolution specialist. She spent five years advocating on behalf of special needs children. She is the mother of three. Her youngest daughter, Dominique, is a low-functioning autistic girl (aged 12 at the time of printing). 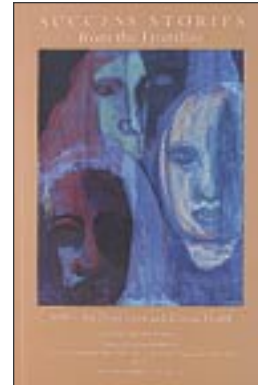
Intellectual Disabilities and Mental Health

An anthology of first-person stories by patients and their families, *Success Stories from the Frontline* is a frank depiction of what life is like for people with both a developmental disability as well as a mental illness (for example, autism combined with obsessive-compulsive disorder). Acclaimed by psychiatric professionals, this is essential reading for those who have a loved one with this double diagnosis or who work in the mental health field. The stories are real and powerful. A useful resource, the book's summary explains causes of mental illness and the diagnostic process, while the glossary provides succinct explanations of mental disorders, symptoms and medications. The book highlights the need to raise awareness of this dual-diagnosis population and to provide more resources to address their special vulnerabilities.

Dr. Robin Friedlander is a psychiatrist and a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of British Columbia. He works with children with neuro-developmental disorders and their families at the Neuropsychiatry Clinic at BC Children's Hospital. He is also Clinical Director of the West Coast & Fraser Valley mental health support teams, which provide specialized community-based mental health treatment for adolescents and adults with developmental disabilities (DD). Born and educated in South Africa, he is married with two adolescent boys.

Tina Donnelly was a psychiatric nurse at Woodlands Residential Facility in New Westminster, BC for 19 years. She has worked in the practice of community mental health ever since a personal experience with a family member directed her interest towards people diagnosed with developmental disabilities. For the past ten years she has managed two community health teams in BC's Lower Mainland providing services to people with intellectual disabilities and mental illness. Tina promotes a multimodal treatment approach, which incorporates a wide variety of professionals. Within this framework, and with strong family and/or caregiver support ensuring the continuity of treatment plans, individuals often show real progress.



Madeline Hombert (editor) is a writer for newspapers, magazines and film, and a book editor. A mother of three (one with DD), she was nominated as a YWCA "Woman of Distinction" and remains active in her community. She lives in British Columbia.

Excerpt from Chapter 9

Performance Management

You've hired a salesperson, guided her/him through the orientation process, and helped him/her develop a Credo package. Now your new employee is ready to represent your organization, and it's time for you to determine a suitable style of performance management.

Often, people choose one of two ways of managing a salesperson: They micromanage the new employee; or they give their salesperson a desk, a computer, and a phone book, and say, "Go get 'em, tiger." But neither of these methods benefit you or your salesperson.

Performance management is not micromanagement. It is not about setting detailed requirements and checking in three times a day to make sure your employee is getting the job done. However, a lot of people end up micromanaging because they mistrust their salespeople. But keep in mind, you hired this salesperson because of his/her strengths and because you think she/he is capable of generating results. At some point you have to trust your salesperson to do the job.

Ideally, performance management begins with clear expectations. Setting out expectations involves providing feedback and tools to salespeople so they can achieve what's expected of them. As discussed in Chapter 1, treat your salespeople as if they were your customers. Often awesome things happen!

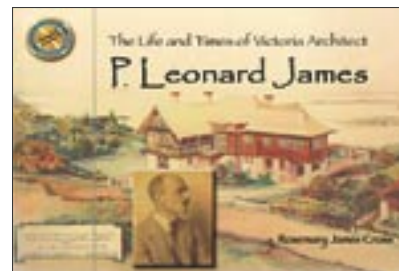
The Life and Times of Victoria Architect

Victoria architect P. Leonard James designed and supervised the construction of the famous Crystal Garden, the Royal Colwood Golf Clubhouse and Royal Jubilee Hospital. This book is a very personal history as told by his daughter, Rosemary. It presents his English training in the 1890s, his move to Canada as an experienced architect in 1906, and his winning of a competition for a hospital on his arrival in Edmonton. In 1947 he designed his last major work, the new Post Office and Federal Building in Victoria, subsequently named after him. The author presents a well-researched life story in a relaxed, entertaining style, including vignettes of local history and discussions of changes that the English Arts and Crafts underwent before and after WW I.

This intelligent and sensitive book earned the author the 2005 Mark Madoff Heritage Award, The Heritage Society of B.C. 2005 Award for Outstanding Achievement, and an Honourable Mention from the B.C. Historical Federation 2005. In recognition of her work, Cross has been granted a Medal of Honorary Membership in the Architectural Institute of British Columbia.

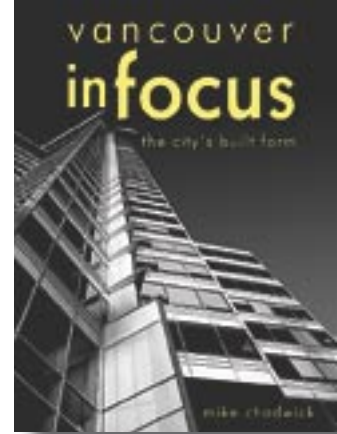

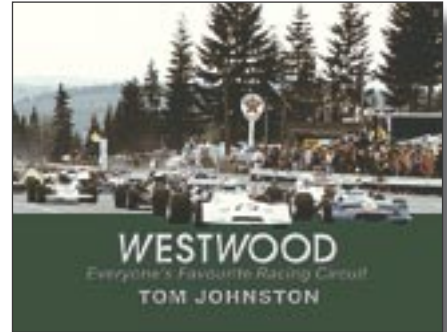

Westwood (or “Wetwood” as some called it) was the first purpose-built automobile road-racing track in Canada. Its location in Coquitlam on the slopes of British Columbia’s coastal mountains meant that it often rained, but the rest of the time it may well have been the most beautiful racing circuit in the world.

The track was built and owned by the Sports Car Club of British Columbia. SCCBC members viewed it as a special place where family members of racing enthusiasts grew up over its 32 seasons. The track ran just about any kind of racing that came along for cars, motorcycles and karts, but was best known for its spectacular races for smaller formula cars, Formula Atlantic in particular.

Sadly, in 1990 Westwood suffered the common fate of racetracks located near expanding cities worldwide and was converted into a housing development and golf course.

Tom Johnston, author of Sports Car Road Racing in Western Canada (see page 21), is a Canadian Motorsport Hall of Fame inductee. After a 35-year career at Keen Engineering Co. Ltd., one of Canada's largest mechanical-engineering consulting firms, he became president and CEO of the company. In 2000, he suffered a serious stroke but overcame its debilitating effects to research and write four motor-racing books. He lives in West Vancouver with his wife, Sharon.
